Pets as Therapy


Teddy (and her owner Alison) volunteer for the charity Pets as Therapy, whose aim is to bring animal companionship to hospitals, hospices, nursing homes and schools by means of visits from their registered, temperament-tested pets. Launched in 2010, Read2Dogs is a scheme developed to help children gain confidence in reading. Some children can find reading quite daunting and can, as a result, become nervous and lacking confidence. However, reading to a PAT Dog often feels far less stressful! PAT Dogs provide comfort, encourage positive social behaviours, enhance selfesteem, motivate speech and inspire young people to

have fun. It has been proven to help children gain confidence and they enjoy and benefit greatly from the reading experience.
