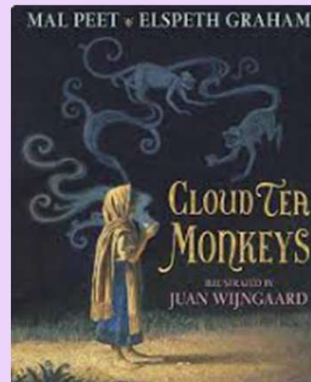
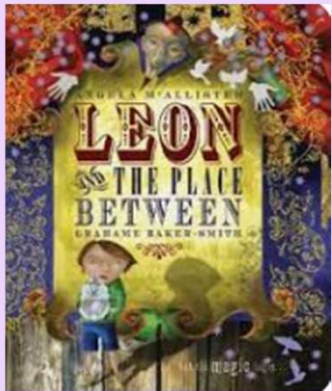

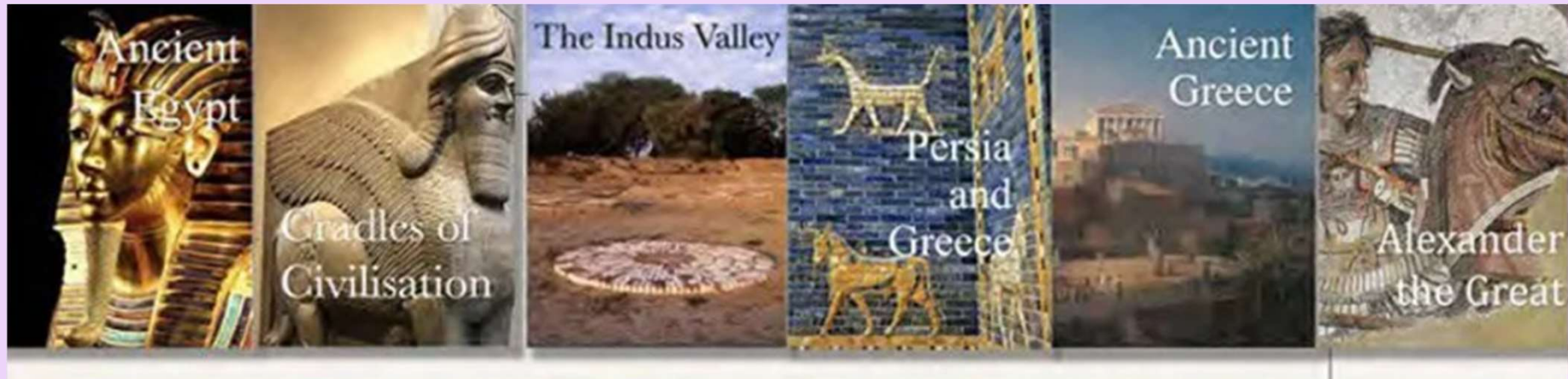

Snacks and Water bottles



- In KS2 children bring in their own snacks to eat at breaktime.
- This need to be a **healthy** snack such as fruit. There should be no nuts, crisp or chocolate bars.
- All water bottles and uniform should be labelled as this makes it easier to locate belongings.



Attendance



Across the school year:

- $\frac{1}{2}$ day missed every week or a day a fortnight = 90% attendance by the end of the year
- 1 day missed every week = 80% attendance
- 1 school year at 90% attendance = **4 whole weeks** of lessons MISSED
- 1 school year at 80% attendance = **8 whole weeks** of lessons MISSED

Statistics show that **children who have an attendance level of 95% and above are far more likely to achieve academic success than those with poor attendance who tend to fall behind in their learning.**

We know there are some children for whom absence is unavoidable. We would never expect or want children to come into school if they are unwell.

However, if it's 'just' a cold, or a late night with family on Sunday, please send them in to let their friends perk them up!
