Specialist Provision:

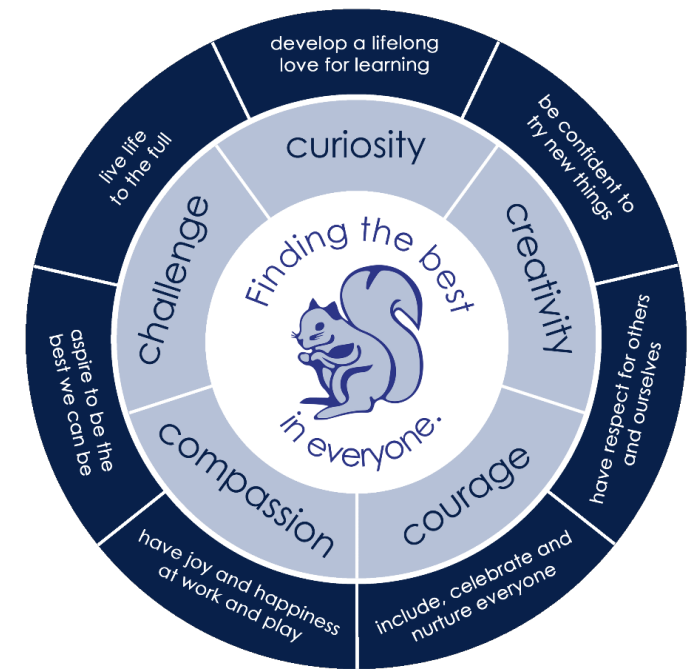
This is for those few children who require a personalised approach, tailored to their specific difficulties. These children will have significantly greater difficulty in learning than their peers and they may require support from outside agencies.

Targeted Provision:

Some children require additional support, which can be delivered through small group or individual intervention, in order to support them to achieve in line with their peers. This support is specific and time-bonded and is over and above what is offered through our core provision.

Core Provision:

The majority of children achieve well through high quality teaching in the classroom. High Quality Teaching meets children's needs through a rich and carefully differentiated curriculum using a variety of teaching strategies and resources.



Area of Need: Cognition and Learning

Core Provision

- Differentiated curriculum planning, delivery, activities and outcomes
- Explicit instruction with a focus on clear instructions and explicit language
- Modelling, visual aids and demonstrations
- 'Chunking' content
- Frequent check-ins
- Teaching Assistant (TA) support
- Focused small group work with Teacher/TA
- Flexible grouping based on assessment for learning
- Guided practice
- Phonics teaching and group work using Song of Sounds
- Peer talk
- Individual, paired and small group reading
- Use of the outdoor learning environment
- Scaffolding through use of visuals, e.g. word and sound mats, visual timetables, writing frames, worked examples, etc. or concrete resources and manipulatives, e.g. Numicon, Base 10, Dictaphone, etc.

- Use of technology including interactive whiteboard, visualiser, laptops, Learnpads and Chrome Books
- Peer- and self- assessment through use of clear and relevant learning objectives and success criteria
- Learning challenges
- Revision sessions / booster groups (for Year 6 children)
- Dyslexia friendly teaching strategies, e.g. additional time, coloured backgrounds, spell-checkers etc.
- Consideration of seating position within the class
- Use of fiddle toys, wiggle cushions, etc. to aid concentration
- Growth Mindset philosophy
- Staff aware of individual needs
